From the Pastor's Desk

Grace and Peace to your from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ

What is Pentecost? This is something I have asked our confirmands. I told them that Pentecost derives its name from the Jewish festival celebrating the harvest and the giving of the law on Mount Sinai fifty days after the Passover. Fifty days after Easter. It is a day when we celebrate the Holy Spirit as God's presence within and among us. In the book of Acts, it describes the receiving of the Holy Spirit as a "sound like the rush of violent wind", not like we also thought like Jesus breathes the Holy Spirit on his disciples. This gave the disciple the ability to "speak in tongues" in languages what the Spirit gave them. We too are given Holy Spirit at our Baptism and are then sent out to proclaim God's redeeming love to the entire world.

In worship we gather around the waters of Baptism, we hear God's word through the scriptures, and we share in the bread and wine. These experiences are for us the meaning of grace and the sharing of ourselves to the world. At the end of worship, we are sent out with the power of the Holy Spirit to look for grace at work, to share our good works, and to glorify our Father in heaven.
